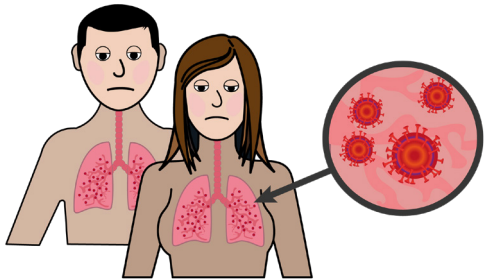




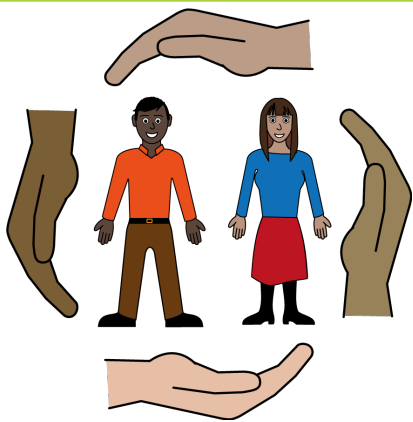
Coronavirus Vaccination

If people with a learning disability get Coronavirus it can sometimes make them very poorly.

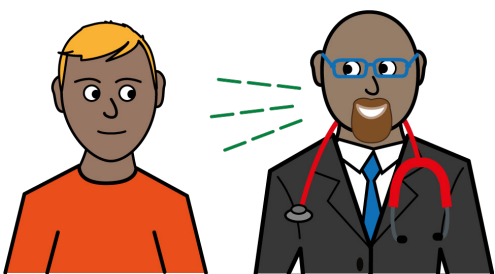
You will be invite soon to have your Coronavirus vaccination.



The Coronavirus vaccination has been made to **help protect you**.

The vaccinations have been tested on lots of people.

Only a few people had a serious side effect after their vaccination.

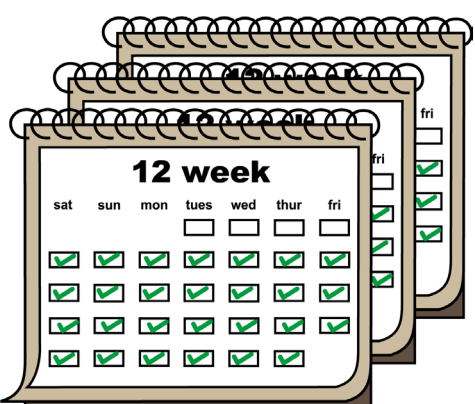


Please wait for your GP to get in touch with you to ask if you want the Coronavirus vaccination.

When you make your appointmet tell them about your **reasonable adjustments**.

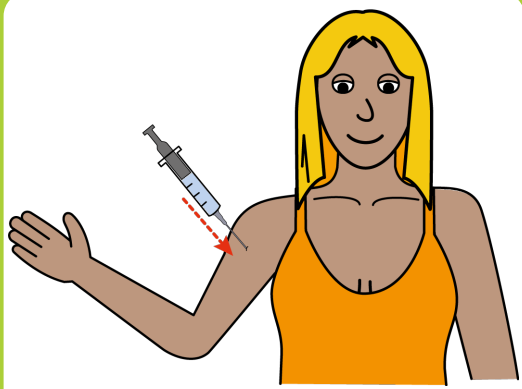


You **must tell your GP** if you have **ever had a serious allergic reaction**.



The Coronavirus vaccination is given as **two injections**.

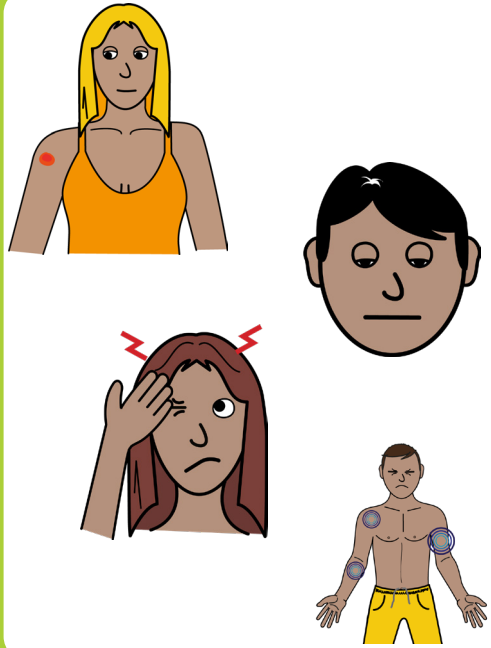
You will have your **second vaccination 10-12 weeks after** your first vaccination.



The Coronavirus vaccination will go into the **top of your arm**.

The vaccination doesn't hurt but you may **feel a little scratch**.

After your vaccination staff may ask you to wait for **15 minutes** to make sure you are okay.

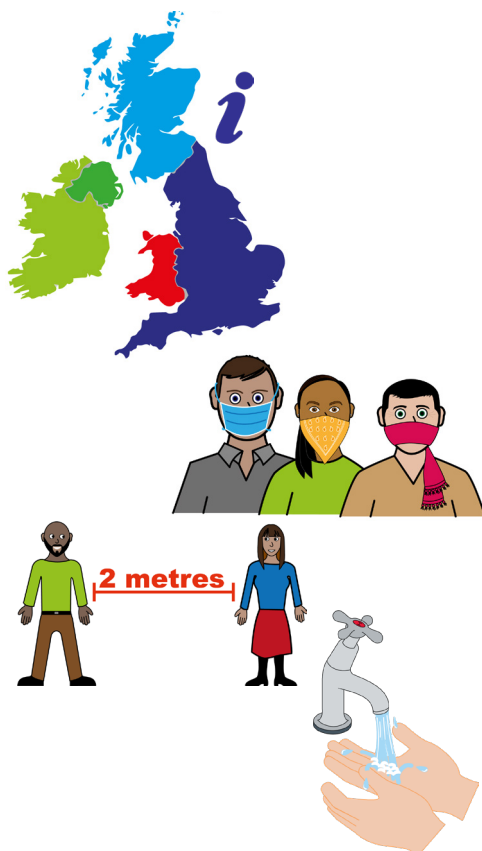


You may have some **side effects** after the vaccination

- **Sore arm** where the needle went in
- **Feeling tired**
- **A headache**
- **Feeling achy**



If your **symptoms get worse** or you are **worried** call 111



When you have the vaccination you still need to follow the Government rules

- **Lockdown** guidelines
- **Wear a face covering**
- **Social distance**
- **Wash your hands regularly**
