

# Legal and Professional Frameworks for Working with People with a Learning Disability in Non-Specialist Setting

**Course options:**  
Masters level course  
Non-credit bearing course

As a health or social care professional you will come into contact with individuals who have a diagnosis of a learning disability. In addition to having a learning disability, they may also have additional needs or diagnoses, including autism.

These modules provides an opportunity for you to:

- Develop your knowledge and understanding of the legal, ethical and professional obligations when working with people who have a learning disability.
- Become more confident as you implement key legislation and ethical principles pertaining to people with learning disabilities.
- Use case study examples in order to participate in reflective exercises to allow you to evaluate your current knowledge and skills and build upon them.

## Course structure

These courses can be studied either at Masters level or as a non-credit bearing course:

- Masters level, you will be assessed at the end of the course. Upon successful completion will be awarded 20 Masters level credits.
- Non-credit bearing, you will study the same content as the accredited course but you will not be assessed at the end.

The content will be delivered through face-to-face seminars and workshops. They will be supported by a wealth of high-quality online content designed to inspire and stimulate you to engage in the course and develop your own practice.



## Entry requirements

You must:

- Be working in a health or social care environment.
- Have access to a computer with a reliable internet connection.
- Have the ability to access and use online study guidance and support.

For students wishing to enrol on the Master's level course:

- You must have an honours degree at 2:2 or above, have studied at honours level or can demonstrate appropriate knowledge and skills at honours degree standard. We will consider other qualifications and experience on an individual case basis.

If your first language is not English, you will need to meet the minimum requirements of an English Language qualification. The minimum of IELTS 6.0 overall with no element lower than 5.5, or equivalent will be considered acceptable.

## Fees

This course may be eligible for funding from Health Education Yorkshire and the Humber. You must have your employer's support in order to access to a funded place. If you are not eligible for funding, the tuition fee for 2022/23 entry is:

- Masters level course - £921.80
- Non-credit bearing course - £460.90
