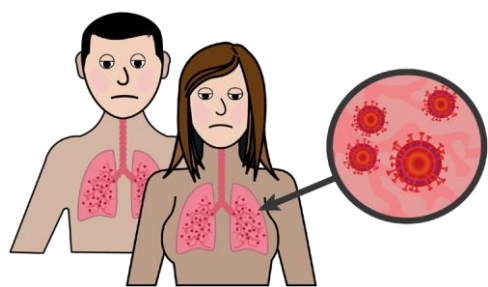




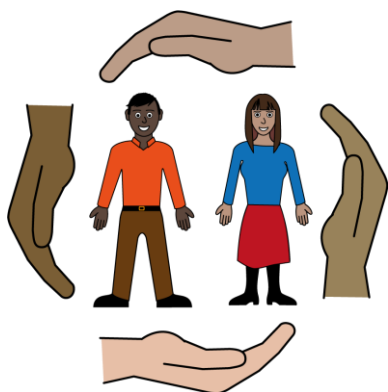
# Coronavirus Vaccination

## Information for Patients



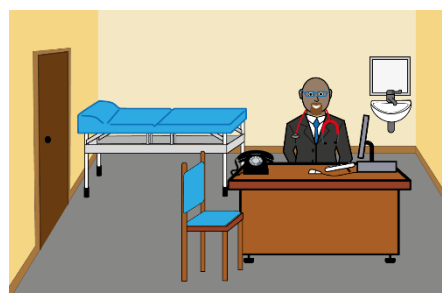
If people with a learning disability get Coronavirus it can sometimes make them **very** poorly.

To protect people with a learning disability you will be invited to have a Coronavirus vaccination.



The Coronavirus vaccination has been made to **help protect you**.

The vaccinations have been tested and very few people have had a serious side effect after their vaccination.



If you are on the Learning Disability register, a health professional **may** get in touch to ask if you want the Coronavirus vaccination.

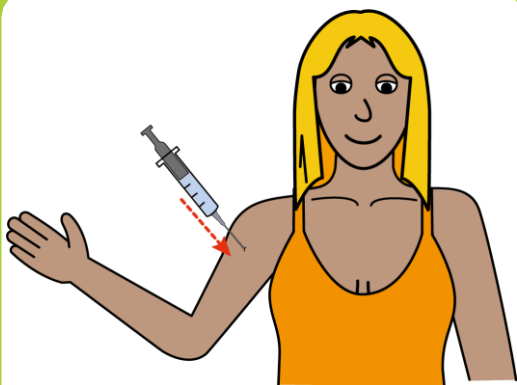

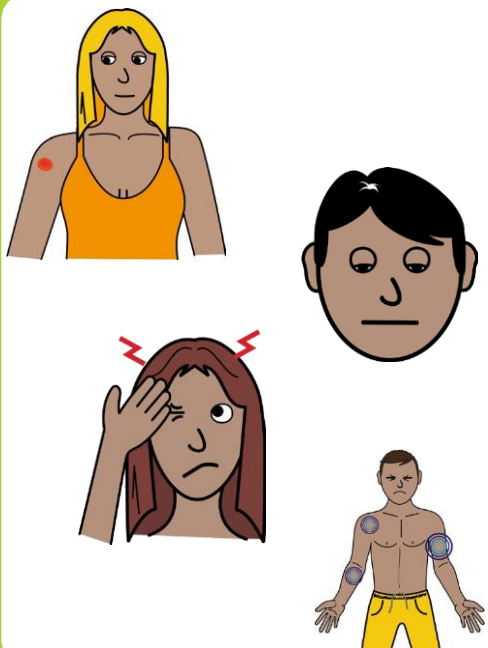


You **must** tell the **person** who **gives you the vaccination** if you have **ever** had a **serious allergic reaction**.



The Coronavirus vaccination will go into the **top of your arm**.

The vaccination doesn't hurt but you may **feel a little scratch**.



You may have some **side effects** after the vaccination:

- **Sore arm** where the needle went in
- **Feeling tired**
- **A headache**
- **Feeling achy**
