Holly Larkin joined the team as an Involvement Co-ordinator in September.




Hi, I am really happy to work with the Involvement Team. Everyone has been very kind and made me feel welcome. I can't wait to meet everyone and do some projects with you.

- planning and leading activities for conferences








#### **Bigger and better labels**


#### More about interviewing

Jonathan said


Jonathan used his new skills to help when he sat on an interview panel for the Learning Disability service with Ann and Lisa.






## **Sharing information and ideas**


#### our student placements


It is a team I never knew I was the biggest fan of! I look forward to seeing what you all get up to next as you are all truly awesome!

#### **Coffee Afternoon by Lisa**


Lisa had the brilliant suggestion to host a coffee afternoon as part of the Macmillan campaign and share information about cancer.




