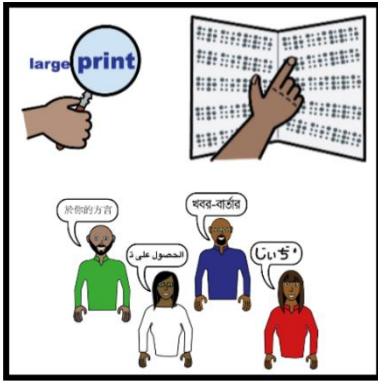

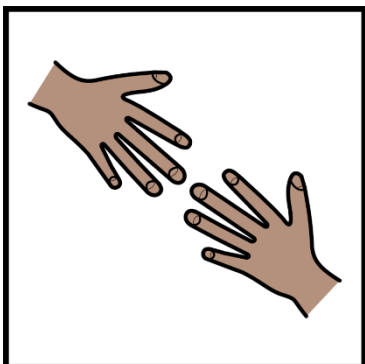

Who are we?



We are the **HHIB** Team.

HHIB stands for homeless and health intervention beds.



Intervention means being helped to do something.

This could be something like a health goal.



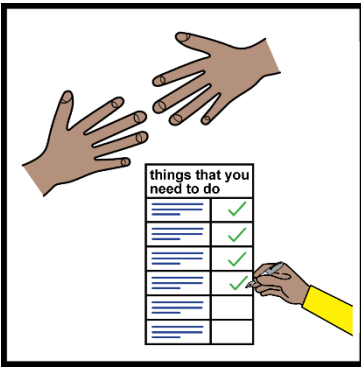
Intervention beds are somewhere people can stay when we are helping them and they do not have a home.



They also help people avoid going to hospital.



We are a team of nurses, **navigators**, support workers, social workers, housing workers, and doctors.



Navigators are people who help to guide you through your healthcare journey.

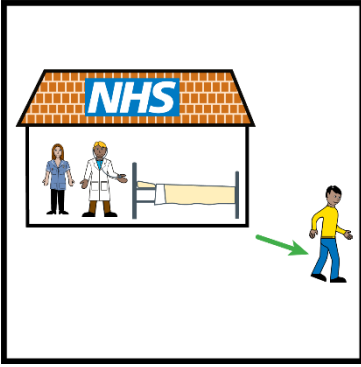


We are a community team.

What do we do?



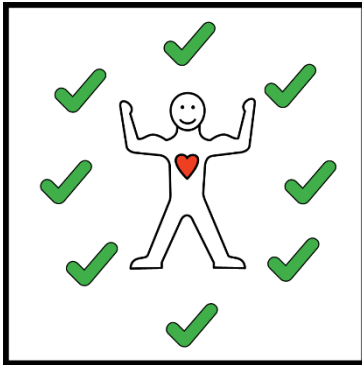
We work with people who do not have a home.



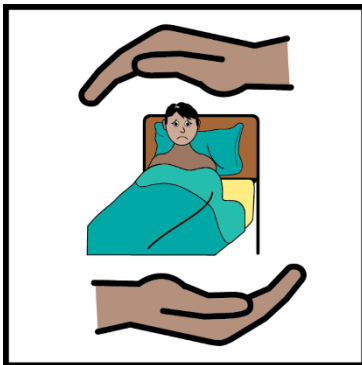
We work with people when they leave hospital.



We also work with people so they do not have to go to hospital.

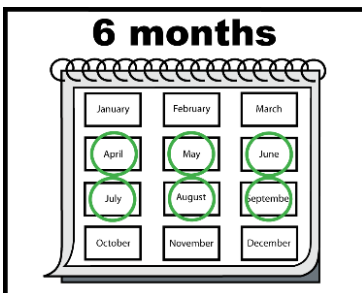


We work with people so they can reach good health.

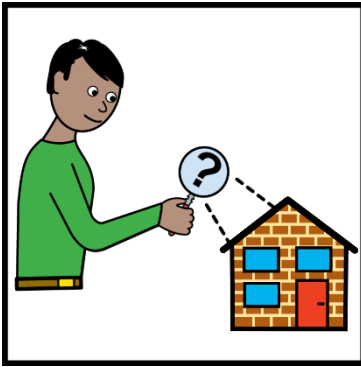


We sometimes care for people who need **palliative care**.

Palliative care is the support and care people have when their illness can't be cured. It means making the person as comfortable as possible.



We can work with people for about 6 months.



We help people find a home after they leave our service.
